
## **Collaborative Activities**

#### NORTH ZONE & NSC RP & WH WG

#### Hydrology and Heritage: Himalayan River Ecology: Sustenance and Responsible Intervention

#### 29 July and 12 August 2023

In view of the flooding of heritage areas in the river Yamuna basin a dialogue on the Himalayan river ecology's relationship with the historic settlements and the current reasons for the devastating flooding in the North India was conducted on two days, 29th July 2023 and 12th August 2023. The panellists acknowledged the need to understand the hydrological heritage resources from the past and their relevance in the ecocentric planning of historic cities today. Experts Suruchi Shah, Vikram Soni, Prof Meenakshi Dhote voiced concern about the incompatible interventions with respect to the river's inherent nature and the aspects that need to integrated in the planning process, stressing on maintaining the health of flood plains to prevent contamination. Jagan Shah and Madhav Raman spoke about the Yamuna flood plain and the measures already tabled in the past which have not been implemented. In this session the Himalayan ecology parameters were examined in a scientific manner through the historic and present times perspective to prevent disasters due to flash flooding, the private and government initiatives were examined to list out parameters for further work on the topic.

#### **RVCA, BANGALORE'S ACTIVITY (INTERNAL)**

#### RVCA Institutional Member's Annual Activity: RVCA as an Institutional member has conducted a Design Studio

#### August to December 2023

The significance of Historic buildings and their spatial propositions are constantly under a critical lens due to the change in the pattern of everyday life systems. Thus, such spatial expressions are preserved under extremely controlled regimes or facing major transformation, primarily the economy-driven logic. The values and meaning embedded within the built expressions must be recognised and understood before proposing changes to fulfill contemporary needs. Architectural responses to contemporary needs will create new meanings for the existing spaces. But changing the value and significance also demands a sense of responsibility and caring intervention after acknowledging the existing meanings embedded in the historically built fabric. Spatial needs in contemporary times are different, as gadgets, equipment, furniture, vehicles and physical infrastructure largely drive them. Changes in everyday life patterns determine the transformations that must be understood before proposing a new need-based spatial appropriation.

As an institutional member of ICOMOS, R V College of Architecture has undertaken periodic academic exploration to understand a historical layer and develop an architectural design language based on that. A design studio at seventh semester level (RVCA VII Sem Section B) was conducted at KILIMANOOR Palace, Trivandrum, Kerala, the ancestral property of Raja Ravi Varma- the great painter. The studio focused very objectively on finding the 'Meta' elements through the lens of Vernacularism and then underlying those understandings in Architectural Design. A team of experts such as Mr. Bikramjit Chakraborty, Mr. Dinesh Rao, Ms. Megala G and Ms. Suman Paul mentored the Design Studio regularly. Raja Rama Varma ji, the present representative of the family, supported the entire exploration. During the studio journey, the work was reviewed by eminent experts like Prof. Sarad Sundar, Dr. Benny Kuriakose, Prof. Anne Feestra and Ar. Meeta Jain. Advanced documentation techniques like LiDAR and Drones have been used to capture the authentic data set utilized during the design decision-making process. These are the students whose work is recommended for future reference. Trace Origin Of Madras @ Pulicat

26 August 2023



Every year, Chennai celebrates its past glory to boost its cultural heritage image during the month of August at various places in the city. Our heritage celebrations provide an opportunity for the city dwellers to trace the story of its origin at Pulicat. AARDE Foundation, a not-for-profit Trust, organized a full-day heritage trip on August 26th 2023 to Pazhaverkadu for heritage lovers to trace Chennai city's origin.



Pazhaverkadu, famously known as Pulicat, is located to the north of Chennai at 55 km on the Coromandel Coast. This coastal village is famous for its second-largest brackish water lagoon in South Asia, measuring 759 sq. km, and for its two-thousand-year's old maritime history. More than seventy thousand migratory birds visit Pulicat Lagoon every winter, and its built heritage reflects the history of the first European administration in South India.



Xavier Benedict, ICOMOS India member, the founder of AARDE, explained and guided the walk based on his two decades long research based on the nature-culture linkages of the Coromandel Coast. His talk traced the reasons for Europe's decision to establish its COTTON ROUTE and its administration in India. Madras Heritage Day celebration at Pulicat had a visit to the Pulicat Interpretation Center, Dutch and Portuguese Cemeteries, Adi Narayana Perumal Temple, Tamil Mosques, Portuguese Church, and the Lagoon. The day trip from Chennai started with 31 participants at 7:00 a.m. on August 26th and returned to the city by 6.00 p.m.


